**Position:** Faculty Member, Tenure Track. This is a state-funded 12-month (1.0 FTE) position.

**Rank and Salary:** Assistant Professor or Associate Professor, salary commensurate with qualifications and experience. For the rank of Associate Professor, a history of external research funding is also required.

**Benefits:** The University of Oklahoma is an Equal Opportunity/Affirmative Action Employer. Women and minorities are encouraged to apply. As part of the compensation package, the OUHSC offers a competitive benefits program that includes medical, dental, vision, and life insurance coverage and retirement packages.

**Location:** Oklahoma City is the anchor of a rapidly growing, multicultural metropolitan area with a population of 1.3 million, over 300 days of sunshine annually, very affordable cost of living, excellent schools and a wide array of cultural amenities.

**Application Deadline:** Review of applications will begin immediately and continue until a suitable candidate has been selected.

**Responsibilities of the Position:** Teaching graduate courses; serving on masters and doctoral committees; developing and sustaining an active portfolio of extramurally funded research; conducting applied analyses and disseminating findings to the academic, professional, and local communities; engaging in university and professional service. The proportion of effort devoted to teaching, research, and service, and a start-up package for research, will be negotiated. The position is located at the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center in Oklahoma City. Opportunities exist for interdisciplinary and collaborative research initiatives and training programs with other departments and centers throughout the University of Oklahoma Health Sciences Center and on the University of Oklahoma main campus in Norman, 20 miles south of Oklahoma City.

**Minimum Requirements:** Candidates for this position must have a doctoral degree (Doctor of Philosophy, Doctor of Science, or Doctor of Public Health) in environmental health, environmental microbiology, industrial hygiene, environmental science, or a closely related discipline such as toxicology, chemistry, biology, or physics; a record of publications in peer-reviewed national or international scholarly journals; and evidence of potential to obtain extramural funding. A record of teaching at the graduate level and current CIH certification or eligibility to take CIH examination within 4 years is preferred. For the rank of Associate Professor, a history of external research funding is also required.
