Master of Public Health in Health Administration and Policy***

The University of Oklahoma College of Medicine, College of Public Health, and the Graduate College offer an innovative degree program that reflects the students' interdisciplinary interests. Individuals pursuing the dual degrees would be prepared to practice medicine and complement that practice with health administration and policy expertise. Applicants wishing to pursue the MD/MPH dual-degree program of study must be accepted into both the MD degree program and the MPH program.

The medical degree (MD) is a traditional four-year program with two years of basic sciences, two years of clinical education and a longitudinal focus on physician-patient relationships. The Master of Public Health (MPH) degree in Health Administration and Policy is a 44 semester credit hour program that is typically completed during a one-year period between completion of the second and third years of medical school studies, though some of the course work may be completed before beginning the first year of medical school.
